

- Publication of Culture Builds Florida's Future strategic plan in 2005

What we do

- Contract with established and emerging artists and arts organizations
- Increase access for Florida's rural and underserved citizens
- Enhance State educational curriculum
- Promote cultural tourism
- Provide a catalyst for economic development
- Provide positive alternatives through cultural experiences for at-risk youth and elders
- Promote Learning, Wellness and Access as benchmarks for healthy communities

Economic Impact

- The Arts contribute over \$2.9 billion toward gross state product annually
- The Arts create over 28,000 full time jobs, adding \$877.8 million to income statewide
- Florida's non-profit arts industry grew 40% in 4 years
- In one year, non-profit arts and cultural organizations expend \$617 million
- \$44 local dollars are expended for each state dollar invested in the arts
- More than 25.6 million people attended cultural events funded by the Division of Cultural Affairs in FY 05
- The DCA has facilitated the investment of over \$400 million in the arts in Florida

Direct Services

- Coordinate exhibitions within the Capitol Complex
- Gather and disseminate information via electronic and print media
- Recognize outstanding artists and arts contributors through annual awards programs, such as the Florida Artist Hall of Fame
- Cultural grants
- Statewide Cultural Facilities Program
- Provide professional & technical assistance and workshops
