Organization Mission Statement

The Division of Cultural Affairs promotes the arts and culture as essential to quality of life for all Floridians.

Arts Education Program Overview

Arts in Education promotes arts and culture in education. Arts in Education project grants are designed to cultivate learning and artistic development for all students and teachers by promoting, encouraging and supporting arts and culture as an integral part of education and lifelong learning for residents and visitors. This includes the learning and artistic development of preK -12 students and teachers, and initiatives and proposals that help applicants to work as individuals or partners to carry out community programs and school reform through the arts. The Division supports the view that the arts build cultural understanding, mutual respect and strong communities. Arts in Education projects accomplish this by bringing artists and cultural experiences directly into schools, hospitals, nursing and eldercare facilities, senior centers, correctional facilities, community spaces, cultural facilities and other organizations in Florida.

There are two funding categories for Arts in Education projects: Artist Residency and Arts Partnerships. Residencies place professional Florida artists in a variety of education and community settings that allow them to teach all aspects of their art form, create or perform works of art so that participants may observe and be a part of the creative process, and relate their art form to other curriculum areas or disciplines. All residencies must relate to core curriculum or Sunshine State/Florida Comprehensive Assessment Testing Standards (for residencies targeted to pre-K through grade 12) or community needs and goals (for residencies targeted toward colleges, after-school programs and cultural and social/community service programs).

The Arts Partnership category is designed to support projects that will advance arts education and the development of long-term partnerships through effective collaboration among community, arts and cultural organizations, social service agencies, and educational entities. These projects must clearly define the partners and their responsibilities and resources (financial and otherwise); identify key personnel and/or consultants; identify the project goals and outcomes, and demonstrate that evaluation instruments are developed and data collection systems are in place. Audiences to consider when planning these can include preK -12 students, adults, persons with disabilities, economically disadvantaged persons, underserved and/or at risk populations, multicultural populations and nontraditional students.

Annual Events

Arts Day

This event provides information to the field regarding the state of the arts, and allows opportunity for the secretary of state and other officials to address the constituency. Sometimes awards or honors are made during this event at the state capitol.

Heritage Awards

The Florida Artist Hall of Fame awards are presented at this event as are the Florida Book awards, the Great Floridian Award and others. Attended by the governor and secretary of state as well as other officials, this is an evening when the state's highest cultural honor is given.

Professional Development Services

Provision of Professional Development Trainings, Workshops and/or Institutes

 For classroom teachers, professional development is administered in partnership with another organization. Professional development is typically administered through the Florida Alliance for Arts Education. It coordinates with the Division to provide opportunities to implement its strategic vision for the arts around the state. Teaching artists have been addressed, and arts integration will be the next topic.

Evaluation & Assessment

Program Evaluation for Grantees

- Evaluation tools and frameworks are provided for grantees. Grantees are given suggestions for program evaluation in their guidelines as well as the opportunity to access high-scoring applications that excel in all areas.
- Grantees must submit a final report that includes audiences served (participation numbers including youth, school and non-school based events, elders, artists, etc.), evaluation of proposal and actual budgets. It is expected that the final report will have information about activities specifically addressed in the original application as well as a state expenditure log tracking the use of all state funds during the grant period.

Utilization of Evaluation

The Division's greatest source for evaluation is data from grantees regarding demographic areas, participation numbers and how the proposal directly relates to Florida Comprehensive Assessment Testing or Sunshine State standards, which provide guidelines that each school grade level must meet. The Division can determine areas, especially in rural counties, where outreach is needed based on existing projects or programs. Often, Florida Alliance for Arts Education summits provide vital information for specific areas of need, whether it be arts integration training or artist/teacher development.
