



Figures reflect appropriations to each state arts agency for both programs and operations. To facilitate comparability, this entire analysis *excludes line item funding* (dollars designated by the legislature to pass through the state arts agency's budget to specific organizations). 

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

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

North Carolina Arts Council Grant Award Sites, FY 2010



Percent of Grant Awards




North Carolina Arts Council Grant Award Sites by Area Type


Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) Classification Per US Census Department




Rural/Urban Distribution of North Carolina Arts Council Grant Awards

Percent of Grant Dollars, North Carolina Arts Council FY 2010




