The NASAA Distinguished Public Service Award recognizes exemplary volunteer leaders of the state arts agency (SAA) field—the chairs and council members who work tirelessly on behalf of public support for the arts.

Criteria for Nomination

This award honors an individual whose outstanding service, energy, creative thinking and leadership have had a significant impact on public support for the arts in their state or region.

Eligibility Requirements

- All current and past chairs and council members of SAAs and regional arts organizations (RAOs) are eligible.
- Nominations may be made by any SAA staff or council member or any RAO staff or council member.
- All entries must be received by **June 1, 2022**.

Nomination Procedure

To nominate a chair or council member, complete the materials below and submit your packet following the instructions. Nomination packets should include:

- nomination form
- narrative
- nominee's current resume
- letters of support
