BUILDING NASAA'S CAPACITY


NASAA strengthened its internal capacity to better serve the field.

- Developed new strategy samplers on <u>health and</u>

- Launched a four-part <u>Tribal Relations Training Series</u>
 to help state arts agencies deepen their understanding of
 Native nations and their policy relationships with
 government.
- Advanced <u>creative aging initiatives</u> that support wellbeing, lifelong learning and social connection for older adults, in partnership with E.A. Michelson Philanthropies.
- Provided customized assistance, research and training to help state arts agencies navigate emerging challenges and opportunities.
